



Please consider the following tips and resources to help with budgeting during this time. General Tips



Consider calling your bank or mortgage company to request a stop or skipped payment option for mortgage payments or to renegotiate your mortgage schedule (for example, you may want to consider changing your schedule from biweekly to monthly payments)



Call your financial institution regarding loan payments, or credit card repayments to advocate for alternative re-payment options, or investigate options about payment schedules. Contact your utility company to discuss payment options.

Will 48% Do?

A recent Toronto Star article contextualizes our strike and how it represents a broader struggle ("<u>College Strike the Tip of the Temporary Work Iceberg</u>").

52% of workers in the Toronto area are part-time, contract or temporary. It's a sad comment on the state of work that we would have to even consider this as a comparator group, but here we are.

Our demand of 50 / 50 for full-time and part-time work is, at present, the norm.
